

Sexual Misconduct Procedure (Students)

If you are concerned for your safety, or the safety of someone you know, you should call 000. Please remember, emergency and hospital services are covered by your medical insurance so use them if you need them.

This Procedure has been written for you, or for a fellow student, who has experienced Sexual Misconduct, harm or violence which may have taken place during any point whilst enrolled at UNSW College (the College). Whether you are a current or former student, and whether the act towards you happened on or off campus, or online, this Procedure is designed to provide care and support, resources and guidance.

1. Purpose

This Procedure outlines the steps for reporting and responding to incidents of Sexual Misconduct involving College students. Sexual Misconduct includes but is not limited to Sexual Harassment, Sexual Assault, sexual touching and distribution of sexually explicit material without consent.

2. Scope

This Procedure applies to:

- (a) all enrolled College students, regardless of campus or facility; and
- (b) former students and students currently on leave, where the incident occurred whilst they were enrolled. When a former student reports an incident of Sexual Misconduct, the College may not undertake a misconduct investigation but may refer the former student to support services within the community.

3. Support

Here are some of the options available to you, if you feel ready to disclose your experience: You can choose to disclose your experience to the College for the purpose of seeking support, reporting, or both. Support is available to all students, including those whose report is not related to the College.

Support at the College is available for victim-survivors. The College can also help you to connect with support in the community, where there are specialist support networks and resources for victim-survivors of sexual harm or violence.

First Responders understand the importance of timely access to confidential support, and respect everyone's right to determine their own preferred course of action.

5. Roles and responsibilities

Role	Responsibility
Executive Director, Students	 Receives Incident reports relating to Students Ensures compliance with mandatory reporting obligations for Student reports of Sexual Misconduct.
Student Wellbeing Team	 Manages the College's confidential reporting portal for Sexual Misconduct. Responds to reported incidents and provides information on the College Policy and procedures.

6. Definitions

Definitions and Acronyms		
Sexual Assault	Sexual Assault occurs when a person is forced, coerced or tricked into sexual acts against their will or without their consent, including when they have withdrawn their consent.	
Sexual Harassment	Sexual Harassment occurs where there is an unwelcome sexual advance, or other unwelcome sexual behaviour towards another person, in circumstances where it can be reasonably expected that the person will feel intimidated, humiliated or offended by the behaviour.	
Sexual Misconduct	Sexual Misconduct includes Sexual Harassment or Sexual Assault, sexual touching, sexual acts, conduct involving child abuse material, making or distributing sexually explicit photos or videos without consent, or certain other behaviours of a sexual nature.	
Staff	All employees of the College, including casual employees.	
Student	Is a person enrolled in an approved Program of study at the College whose enrolment has not lapsed or been cancelled.	
Student Wellbeing Advisors	Are members of the College's Student Wellbeing Team professionally trained to provide a trauma informed approach to receiving disclosures of Sexual Misconduct made by Students, providing counselling and referrals to support services.	
Support Staff	Are members of the College's Human Resources Team professionally trained to provide a trauma informed approach to receiving disclosures of Sexual Misconduct made by Staff and Affiliates, providing counselling and referrals to support services.
